WEEKLY TASKS

1. **Reading:** Read aloud to someone 3/4 times a week and to discuss the text, recording the text, date and any opinions/ideas in your reading record. Please bring your reading record in each week with your home learning book.
2. **Multiplication tables** – practise all tables (with division facts) up to and including 12 x 12
3. **Spellings-** we will be teaching and testing a focussed spelling skill each week in school. A list of weekly spellings will be sent home and your child can practise these at home if they wish but this is not compulsory.
4. **English/maths:** one piece of English or maths work will be sent out weekly- this will be practising skills and knowledge that have been taught in school.

Homework will be sent out on Wednesdays and is due in the following Wednesday.

Year 5 will have their PE lessons on **Mondays and Thursdays.**

This term's focus:

In science Year 5 will be learning to identify and explain how different forces act between moving surfaces. Year 5 will be learning about North America in geography. They will be comparing an area of North America to our local environment. In history Year 5 will be learning about Anglo-Saxons and their impact on British History, as well as their settlements, homes and village life.
