



IAL: to identify and describe the basic structure of a plant.

We are going to look at the different parts of a plant.



Look at this plant. Do you know what any of the parts are called?

See the table below to see if you got any of them right.  
Read the information to find out what each part of the plant is for.

 roots	 leaves	 stem	 seed	 flower
Takes in water and nutrients from the soil.	Catches sunlight to make energy.	Holds the plant up and carries water around the plant.	Grows into new plants when they fall into the soil.	Attracts insects and birds.

A \_\_\_\_\_ contains food so a new plant can grow from it.


leaves

IAL: to use a wide vocabulary of everyday historical terms.
