

From rags to riches: Barry Steptoe

Born in London in April 1942, Barry Steptoe is a hugely respected charitable contributor, who rose to fame through establishing a highly successful rag and bone business.

On the day he was born, a terrible flood hit the city of London, making his birth a complicated process as the nurses had to plug the gaps under the doors to stop water pouring in. Fortunately, Barry's birth went well and he and his mother suffered no ill effects.

Barry began work at the age of twelve, when he was given a job in a South London bubble gum factory. He arrived at his interview two hours early, impressing everyone there with his enthusiasm and attitude.

Growing up, he dreamed of having his own business and worked extremely hard, night and day. Shortly after leaving school, Barry set up his own rag and bone business; selling bits of old junk was his speciality. It was at the age of 17 that he first earned enough money to buy a car. His tatty VW Beetle was, despite barely managing to move above 30mph, his pride and joy and he has kept it to this day.

In the early 1970s, Barry decided to employ more staff and his business began to expand, producing huge profits; it was enormously successful and made over £500m by the year 1980.

After years of success in the rag and bone business, Barry began to think about retirement. Having always dreamed of a warm place to live, he decided to move to Australia. Satisfied that he had worked hard enough, he sold his business to his friend, Sid James, who immediately sold it to the council for a vast profit.

On his 39th birthday, Barry married his sweetheart, Maude Boggins and they went on to have five children together. Sadly, Barry lost contact with all but one of his children when he and Maude moved to Australia to live with his mother-in-law.

For the past thirty years, Barry and Maude have been living happily in Melbourne, enjoying the comforts that his hard work has earned. In 1994, Barry established the "Steptoe and Bun" food charity, which distributes food to the homeless. Barry is quoted as simply saying at the time, "It's nice to give something back." He currently has no plans to return to the UK and has told his friends that he would rather wrestle a crocodile than go back to work at his age!

Due to his incredible success and contributions to good causes, the name of Barry Steptoe will always be linked with determination and used as an example of the benefits of hard work.

IAL: to ask effective questions to clarify understanding of a text
