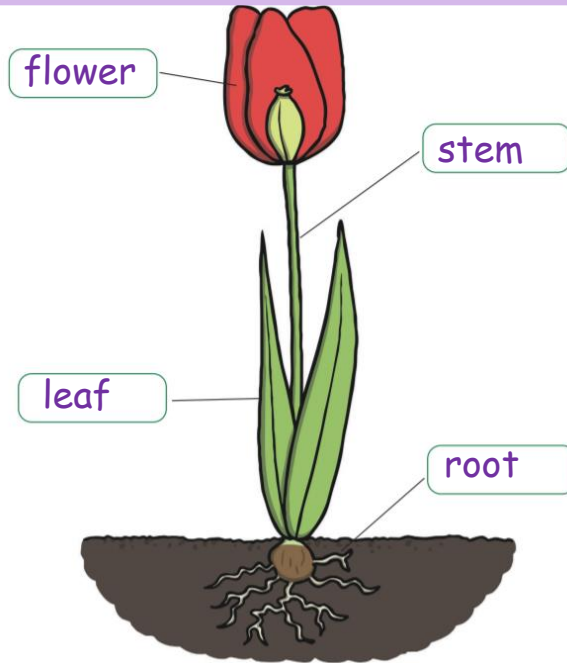


IAL: to describe what plants need to grow and stay healthy

Many plants need soil to grow their roots in. They get nutrients from this.

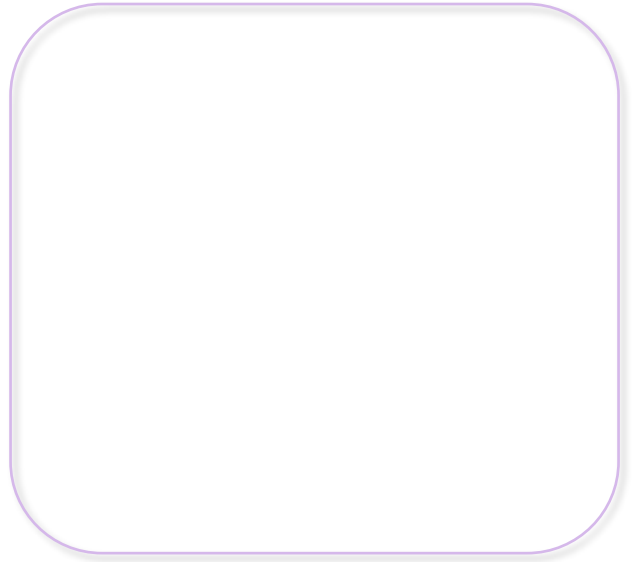

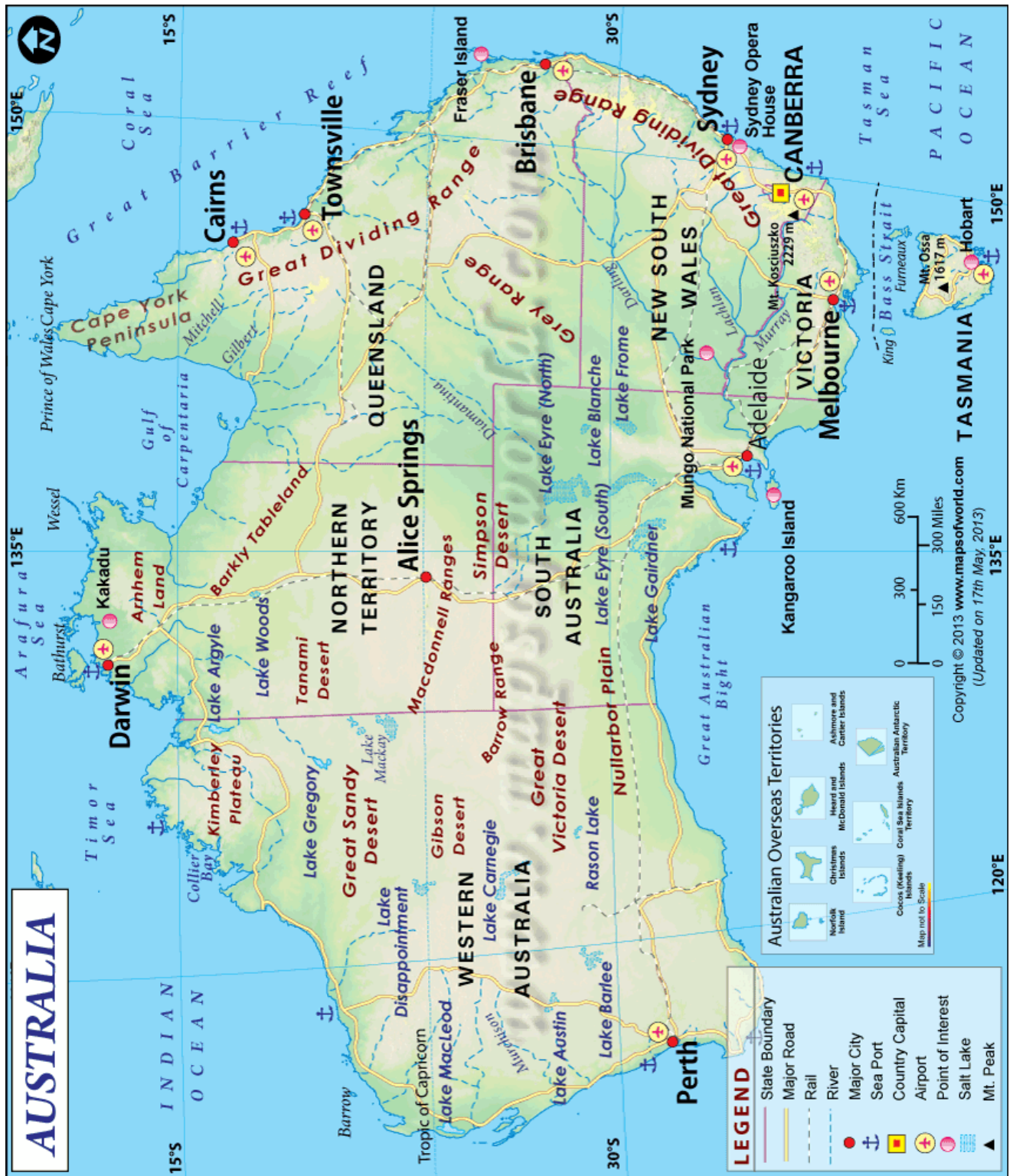
